

PARTICIPATION TRENDS


- Recovered from COVID for individual competition
- Middle Schools have been more cautious to return to squash





JUNIOR RANKED PLAYERS BY AGE DIVISION


- Younger age group participation is robust which bodes well for the future
- U17 participation remains good due to College admissions
- Rankings were frozen in 2020 - 2021 season





JUNIOR RANKED PLAYERS BY STATE

- Most states still in recovery mode
- Overall, there are only approximately 150 players fewer who participated this season compared to 2019-2020 Season






PLAYER PARTICIPATION: WHAT DO WE WANT?

- Engagement at JCT, Gold, Silver and Bronze Level
- Entry level is Bronze, Bronze Level is meaningful
- Player mobility through the levels
- Keep travel requirements as low as possible for as long as possible, everywhere in the country, minimizing missed school days


Tournament numbers must be regulated, based on the size of the system.

Tournaments are assigned using anticipated participation as a guide






2022-2023 SEASON BY THE NUMBERS



- As the level of competition increases, fewer competitions are offered to allow the points structure to function as designed
- The expectation is that there would be more Bronze than Silver tournaments.
- Silver tournaments, while regulated, also need to be allocated broadly by geography
- Fewer Bronze tournaments have been needed to support the current player base.



2022-2023 SEASON BY THE NUMBERS



- Each tournament level should have a distribution with a clear beginning and a clear end
- A trailing end means that any ranking can potentially qualify to play in that level of tournament



TOURNAMENTS

- Summer 2023 schedule complete
- Fall 2023 schedule
 - Gold Tournaments on calendar by end of June
 - Silver and Bronze tournaments listed during June / July
- 2023-2024 season schedule complete by Labor Day
- Summer 2024 calendar announce in January 2024



POLICY UPDATES

• JCTs

- Use holiday weekends where possible to alleviate missed school days
- Labor Day CT JCT
- Columbus Day PA JCT
- Veterans Day West Coast JCT
- MLK Day Mid Atlantic JCT
- Presidents Day Houston JCT

•USJO

• No change - remains as a 4-day tournament December 16-19

Bronze tournaments

- Flexibility with draw size up to 16 (subject to court availability)
- Flexibility selecting which divisions are played out
- Maximum matches per day limited to 3 (except 16 player Bronze tournaments)



POLICY UPDATES — FOR DISCUSSION

- Adjusting division sizes to minimize school absences
- Wildcard positions
- To accommodate a player injury or a gap in play, should we consider wildcards to help them back into the system more quickly?
- Ranking calculation
- Poor results are often not penalized, and so this limits mobility in the system.



FOCUS FOR 2023-2024 SEASON

Continuing to Improve the Tournament Experience

- Referee Education
- Rules Enforcement
- Conduct and Sportsmanship
- Improving the first event experience and providing alternative engagement options



RULES, CONDUCT & ENFORCEMENT: '23-'24

Parents play a central role in supporting sportsmanlike behavior to improve the experience before, during and after a tournament



Education

- Coaches
 - Teach "right way to play" in clinics and lessons

Management

- Officials
 - Control the match using appropriate conduct levels

Enforcement

- US Squash
 - Use appropriate disciplinary measures



RULES, CONDUCT & ENFORCEMENT: '23-'24

- Stricter enforcement of the rules, specifically player behavior
 - Rule 15.5: "Players must not behave in a manner that is unfair, dangerous, abusive, offensive, or in any way detrimental to the sport."
- Communicate clear expectations (posters at clubs, etc.)
- Including endorsement of automatic escalation of Conduct Stroke, Game, Match for the following:
 - If a player's racquet leaves their hand (except during point)
 - If a player speaks to the official other than asking for score or call clarification
 - If a player demonstrates excessive celebration or shouting directly in the face of one's opponent
- Post online the quarterly statistics of Disciplinary Subcommittee actions taken
- Provide a junior officiating clinic for all pros to conduct them at their clubs
